

Firstly, we can now officially announce that we have been successful recipients of the Victorian *Live Music Venues Program*! We received \$75,250 from Creative Victoria to support the BMI in producing, creating, and engaging live music in our venue! We have already been able to use a majority of this funding to upgrade our lighting and audio equipment (thanks to SLC Ballarat for helping us do this), purchase professional live streaming equipment, and the funding has also allowed us to hire new staff (welcome Mark, Katrina, Sam, and Nick).

Once again, thank you to Creative Victoria and the Victorian Government for supporting live music venues.



The first few months of 2021 have been very busy with bookings flying in and enquiries from large artists looking to book the space! We have events from rock music and comedy to weddings and conferences! Make sure you keep an eye on our events calendar for updates on upcoming events!

We have already been able to fit in some great events in January. one of which was hosting a beautiful wedding and reception (congrats **Keenan and Elizabeth**).

In January we also hosted a concert from Fanny Lumsden - country musician with 5x 2021 Golden Guitar wins, and 2020 ARIA winner of best country album - who played to a sold out Minerva Space.



We are busy preparing for the months ahead and creating programs for Ballarat Heritage Festival, Twilight Talks and working closely with other presenters including The Wheeler Centre for Books, Writing and Ideas.

If you have visited recently you may have noticed that we have also had a few updates with our point of sales hardware! We have just changed over to using Square for all cash and EFTPOS sales. This will streamline our record keeping and change how we take sales over the bar! It helps us keep track of stock as well as monitoring sales trends. This upgrade has been supported by the Victorian Government's Small Business Digital Adaptation Program.

We will also be updating our website within the next few weeks! We have been working very closely with Small Dog Design to overhaul our online presence and ensure our website has a cleaner look that is more in-line with the rest of our branding and style.


