She now lives in Toronto. Her work has been shortlisted for the CBC Literary Awards and in 2004 she won the Great Toronto Literary Project.




Book of the Month

The Recipient by Audrey J Cole



But when Aria finds herself falling-after one too many glasses of wine, from a karaoke stage into the arms of Jonathan, a part of her comes back too life for the first time in years.



While enjoying a sleigh ride with his children, an Amish widower, Adam Lengacher, discovers a wrecked


