#### Once Were Wild by Leslie Scott.

When Leslie Scott discovers two brumbies living on the rugged Mount Beckworth, she almost can't believe it. Brumbies don't live in Central Victoria, and the terrain is not suited to them, so how did they get there?

The horses are scared and unused to people, but the mountain is not a safe place for horses. With summer heat on its way, the waterholes are drying up and food is getting scarce-and local rumour has it that logging is soon to begin.

Every day for months Leslie makes the hike up the mountain, slowly but surely building a connection with the two brumbies, but there are other mysterious things happening up there, bones being rearranged into different shapes, and always the question: who left the horses here in the first place?

John Rebus stands accused: on trial for a crime that could put him behind bars for the rest of his life. Although it's not the first time the legendary detective has taken the law into his own hands, it might be the last.

But in this investigation, it seems all roads lead to Rebus – and Clarke's twin loyalties to the public and the police will be tested to their limit.







#### Twilight Talks

#### Local innovation in the spotlight at Twilight Talks

In September the BMI showed why Ballarat is becoming known as a city of innovators in its most recent series of Twilight Talks. The story of Ballarat's *gentleman inventor* kicked things off, with local **Henry Sutton** enthusiast Graeme Gooding, showing how the man, born in a mining tent on the Ballarat Goldfields began working on ideas and concepts in electrical engineering and design from his teens, and his ideas were well ahead of his years. Sutton invented lightbulbs, the hydraulic lift and many other devices, and his inventions are acknowledged to be among the most ingenious of their day.

Ballarat remains a hotbed of innovation to this day, with groundbreaking work in brain cancer being done by Dr Rodney Luwor and the team at the Fiona Elsey Cancer Research Institute, the only regional cancer research facility in the country. In our city too, experts are building bespoke biodigesters at a new business, Gaia Enviro - turning industrial and agricultural waste into energy. Dr Peter Vamplew and his team at Federation University are developing tools to capitalise on the burgeoning artificial intelligence sector, and award-winning architect Talina Edwards is designing the houses of tomorrow.

Audiences were given access to some of the best minds Ballarat has to offer on these topics and more, and a stimulating series of talks was enjoyed by all. Look out for the Twilight Talks' return in February 2023 with a brand new series, and a new round of fascinating local speakers. 


