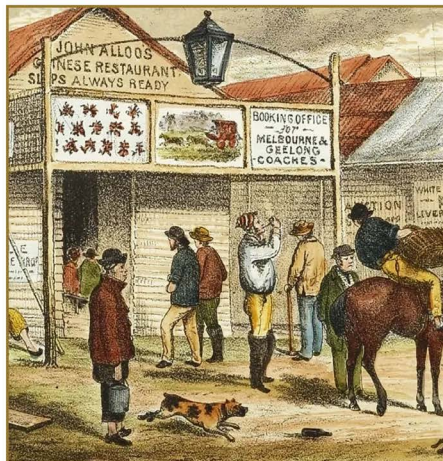

Open Garden & Devonshire Tea

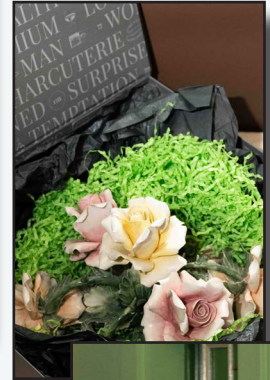

Dr Susan Kellett is a former army nurse who completed her PhD *Australia's Martial Madonna: the army nurse's commemoration in stained glass windows* (1919-1951) in 2016. A special case study was the genesis of the Australian War Memorial's Hall of Memory and the controversial behind-the-scenes debates leading up to its dedication by Queen Elizabeth, decades later. 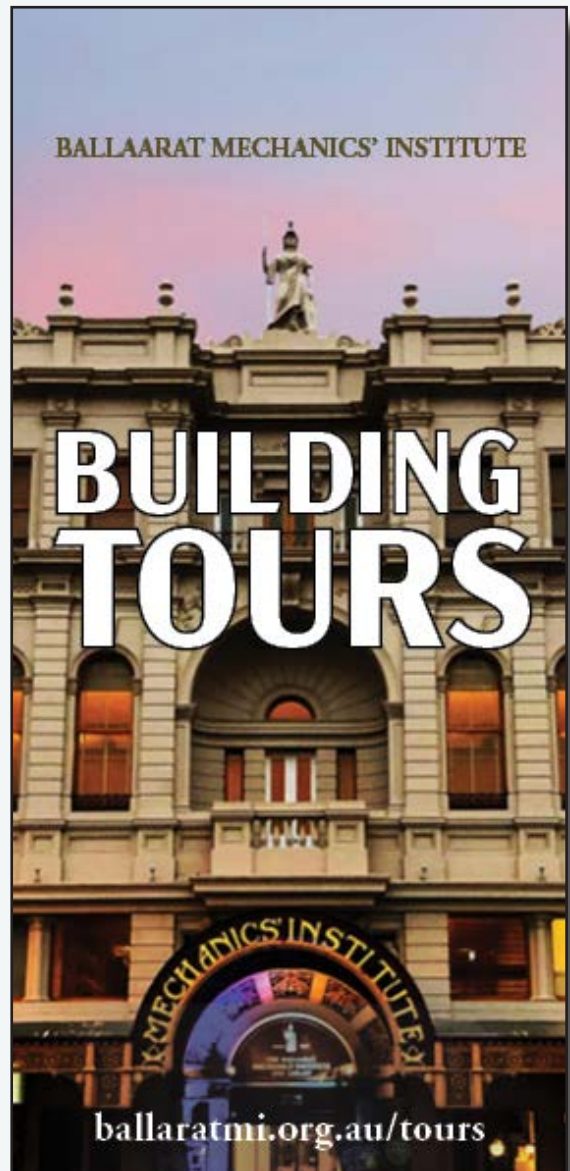
