Tew external relationships within the GLAM (Galleries, Libraries, Archives and Museums) sector have been formed and real and ongoing partnerships have yielded positive results and opportunities thanks to Ellen Becker our Heritage Collection Curator.

The long term audit of the Heritage collection is almost complete, thanks to the **Collections Volunteers**; this project has been running for over 15 years and has resulted in the beautifully presented collection we see in the Heritage Reading Room. This room continues to thrill and intrigue visitors of all ages.

Thanks to our Librarian Rosemary for all her work this year on the very successful Author Talks and now the Membership Drive. We have over 30 new Memberships due to our latest radio and print campaign, thanks also to Radio 3BA and Power FM for their support of our radio advertisement. Rosemary also continues to be our "front of house" and I know that you as Members

appreciate the true customer service she provides as does any member of the public that wander in for a look!

We thank Marilyn Furness (volunteer coordinator) and all her volunteers for their continued commitment to our events, book sales, the library and other areas this year. The BMI has received funding to launch *Stage Ready* — a new non-formal technical-theatre training program for regional creatives. The Ballaarat Mechanics' Institute (BMI) is pleased to announce it has secured \$22,946 to deliver *Stage Ready*, a new non-formal technical-theatre training program designed to support emerging production talent and strengthen regional creative capability.

Launching in 2026, *Stage Ready* delivers practical, real-world experience in lighting, sound, stagecraft, and venue operations. The program is non-formal by design, helping participants develop entry-level technical skills through guided mentorship and

active involvement across BMI and partner venues. This approach strengthens the region's creative and event workforce.

A key strength of *Stage Ready* is its collaborative model. The program will work with multiple event and arts venues, creatives, and regional organisations, building a shared technical workforce that benefits the wider cultural sector. Partners include community theatres, independent artists, creative collectives, festivals, and production companies who contribute mentorship, equipment expertise, and real-world learning opportunities.

The Under World by Sofie Laguna.

Martha Mullins is a misfit. Her mother is glamorous, aloof and judgemental. Her father, mostly absent. Academic and shy, Martha finds herself fascinated by the underworld, a place she learns about in Roman mythology classes at school. To Martha, the underworld and its divine inhabitants provide a place of refuge, escape, imagination and desire.

But Martha also finds joy in friendship, Connection. Intimacy. It's Martha's band of friends who show her the value in spontaneity, fun, laughter. Until it goes wrong.

The Sunbaker by P.A. Thomas.

When overworked forensic pathologist Nicola Fox arrives for a long overdue break at her

holiday house in Brunswick Heads, on the NSW north coast, she's shocked to discover someone sunbaking on one of the sun lounges in her backyard. And that the sunbaker has been dead for some time.

Rumours soon emerge that the sunbaker took more than a few dark secrets to his grave, secrets many people-and especially the police were keen to bury. When the arse-covering and finger-pointing begin in earnest, Nicola finds herself a suspect.

New to town, she only knows one person who might be able to save her: Jack Harris, a journalist at the local newspaper, The Beacon. When he begins investigating, the police organised crime unit arrives, and soon they are threatening both him and Nicola, leaving Jack to wonder if it was the police themselves who had committed the crime.

Can Jack uncover who really killed the sunbaker, and why the body was left in the backyard of a forensic pathologist, before the escalating threats to his own well being become more than just threats?

The American Boys by Olivia Spooner.

Wellington 1942, While Lorna's brothers are overseas fighting for their lives, war rages in the Pacific. As the threat of a Japanese attack on New Zealand seems increasingly real 20,000 US Marines arrive to keep the country safe. The Americans find their new post strange and unwelcoming, but even as cultures clash, romance blooms. After Lorna is persuaded to go on a double date, she befriends Stan a Marine from Chicago.

Handsome and kind, Stan is the golden boy of his

The south is the home of all things queer, says scholar Zandria Robinson as we witness the exhilarating jam-packed story of Little Richard's complex life and musical career, ending only in 2020.

Born in 1932 as Richard Wayne Penniman, by 1955 Little Richard was declared a world rock 'n' roll star with his hit "Tutti Frutti."

Raised on gospel music, experimenting with drag, and drenched with musical talent, he went on to win award after award and reach global stardom.

Interestingly enough, on an Australian tour in 1957, when his plane from Melbourne to Sydney experienced difficulty, he saw a bright red fireball, coinciding with the launch of the Russian satellite Sputnik. He cancelled his last two concerts, renounced rock'n'roll, and declared he was returning to the US to repent and be baptized!

An enlightening film which will fill in the 'gaps' about his turbulent life and his undisputable influence. Amalgamated.




