## Book of the Month

### *A Far-Flung Life* by M.L. Stedman.

Western Australia, 1958 where, for generations, the MacBrides have lived on a remote sheep station, Meredith Downs. A million acres, it's an ocean of arid land.

One ordinary day, on a lonely road, patriarch Phil MacBride swerves to avoid a kangaroo. In seconds, the lives of his entire family are shattered.

Then, instead of leaving them to heal, fate comes back for them in a twist of consequences that will cause one of them to lose their life, and another to sacrifice theirs for the sake of an innocent child. Matt, the youngest MacBride, is plunged into a moral and emotional journey for which there is no map, no guide, as he is forced to choose between love and duty, sacrifice and happiness.

Presented by Hedley Thomson.

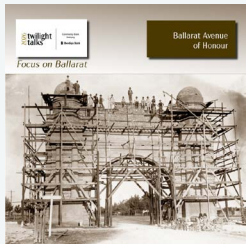

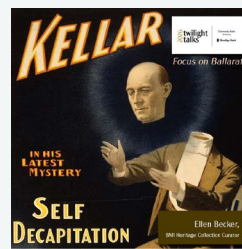

Redemption is a dish best served warm...

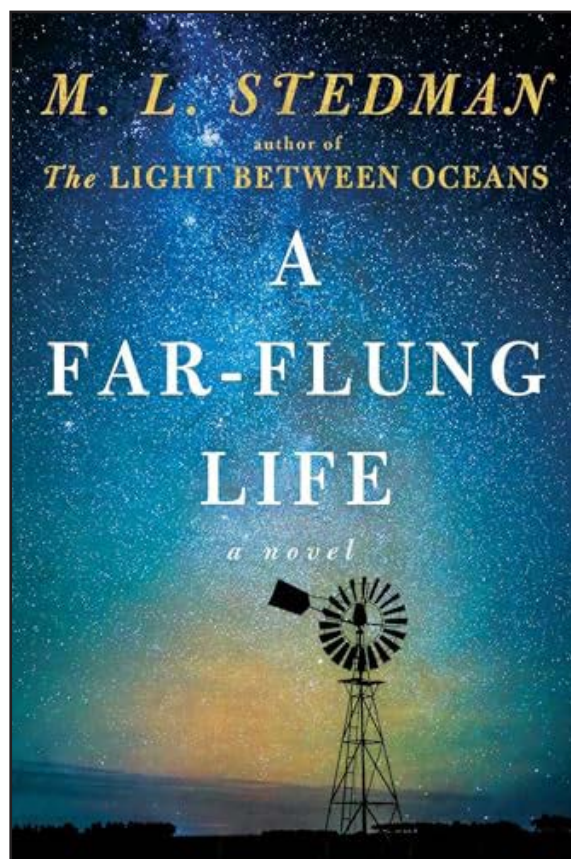
Retired Michelin-star chef Griff Barlow has lost his  
appetite for life. Widowed, grieving and living in  
an aged care facility where beige slop passes for food,  
Griff is done – with guilt, with loneliness and with  
the lie that made headlines when he was diagnosed  
with dementia. Planning one final act, Griff breaks  
into the nursing home kitchen to cook one last lemon  
tart. But the simple act of cooking awakens a long-  
forgotten joy and soon he's restoring flavour, dignity  
and delight to his fellow residents. Meanwhile, his  
estranged sister, Lisa, is grappling with a late-in-life  
ADHD diagnosis, an unexpected romance and  
a frightening health reality of her own. As secrets  
simmer and second chances collide, both siblings are  
forced to confront what it really means to choose life.

Drawing on Anna Johnston's experience working in  
aged care, the novel offers a rare and compassionate  
perspective on how people diagnosed with dementia  
are often dismissed, underestimated and quietly erased.
